Tuesday, November 3, is election day for school board candidates in Santa Clara County. Because school trustees are supposed to represent YOU in spending hundreds of millions in tax dollars, and because they set policy for the education of your children, you owe it to yourself to meet these candidates face-to-face. Even if you are completely satisfied with all aspects of public education or have placed your kids in private schools (you still pay taxes!), you need to know these candidates and their viewpoints before you can cast a properly informed vote.

October 26th is your chance. VEP normally splits its membership for school board candidates' nights since our area is divided by districts as illustrated above. This year the San Jose Unified candidates were already booked for an appearance at Markham Jr. High on our regular meeting night, so we decided to ask our neighbors living WEST of Vistapark to join us at Markham. Those of us who live EAST of Vistapark will meet at Parkview School as usual.

FINAL DECISIONS SCHEDULED FOR GUADALUPE CORRIDOR (Rt. 87)

The Guadalupe Corridor Board of Control has set the following schedule of public meetings to provide an opportunity for local officials and citizens to assist in the selection of a preferred transportation alternative in this right-of-way, stretching from Great America past the airport and the civic center, through downtown to Oakridge Mall on its way to IBM. During the past two years, several modes have been studied (light rail, busways, HOV lanes, expressways, etc.) by a team of technical consultants and bureaucrats. A draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is now being circulated for public comment and will be discussed at these meetings. Time will be allowed for your input at all meetings.

grade-separated highway (expressway or freeway) to accommodate heavy automobile loads without signals at every intersection. San Jose's plans and funding program virtually assures that a roadway will be a part of the ultimate configuration. On the transit side, the long-standing support for a busway/HOV ("diamond") lane in this corridor continues among VEP members. This combination was demonstrated to be most cost-effective and most congestion-reducing of all alternatives under study by the "experts"-- we've known it all along!

Despite this clear superiority in cost-effectiveness, the expressway/busway/HOV alternative is yielding to the politically popular light rail choice— an expensive start—up in what some hope to be an eventual 140-mile network of rail in Santa Clara County. VEP has made its preferences known to officials in the final decision—making process; let's watch to see how <u>Iola Williams</u>, <u>Janet Gray Hayes</u>, and <u>Susanne</u> Wilson (our most directly responsible reps) vote on this issue.

CITY COUNCIL SETS PUBLIC HEARINGS ON GENERAL PLAN CHANGES

The annual review process is underway for proposed changes to our city's master plan for development through 1990. This month (October) the advisory Planning Commission will be formulating its recommendations for final consideration by the City Council. Proposed changes to the plan range from small parcel rezonings to across-the-board increases in allowed densities for certain residential uses. Your input is encouraged -- invited as a legal requirement, in fact.

NEW COUNCIL BOUNDARIES SPLIT VEP MEMBERSHIP AREA

Over the formal objections of VEP and numerous other community organizations, the City Council has adopted a new districting map for San Jose that will be disruptive to our membership areas. Now set until after the 1990 census, new district boundaries split VEP and other established "communities of interest" despite City Charter guidelines that specifically instruct preservation of the integrity of such groups.

On a 6:5 vote, councilmanic boundaries were drawn through the VEP area as follows: District 7 (which presently includes all of VEP) will have its southern border along Capitol to Snell, Snell to Rosenbaum, Rosenbaum to Kingspark, Kingspark to Branham, and Branham to Almaden Expressway. If you live north and west of that jagged line, you are still in District 7, represented by Iola Williams. However, those south and east will be part of a new District 2, represented by Jerry Estruth (by a quirk in the rules) until after the 1984 elections. The new district map will become effective January 1, 1983.

VEP wrote the Council asking that our membership area be left intact (whether in District 7 or preferably in newly-formed District 2) and that the new district be allowed to select its own representative in the 1982 election. We, as others, feared that a split would further erode common interests that have bound our neighborhoods over the past twelve years. Efforts by several councillors to incorporate neighborhood suggestions like ours were cast aside in the final 6:5 vote. Iola Williams voted against us.
