



# 5 Tips to Make Your Home a Secure Place By Jayshree Reddy

Hello neighbors, it's that time of the year! Family, Friends Food & Holidays! Your home is your secure place make sure to follow some tips to make it safe for your loved ones. By combining several different safety features and approaches, your home can be even safer than it is now for the holidays.

#### Home Security Tips:

#### 1. Get an alarm system

It's not clear exactly how many potential intruders are put off by home alarm systems. Some burglars won't mess with security systems. But regardless of how they feel about alarm systems, most burglars don't want to take a chance with alarm systems, So, get a security system, preferably one that alerts even when disabled. #### 4. Shut your blinds at night

Lights on, dark outside? Keep your blinds shut. You'd be surprised by how many burglars take advantage of that time of night when they can see straight into your home.

#### 5. Make porch lights automatic

A peephole isn't very helpful in the dark. Adding automated porch lights, that could cover everything from motion-based lights to a setup

that allows you to turn your lights on at sunset and off at sunrise.



# Update from Friends of Martial Cottle Park

We all love Martial Cottle Park and will continue to work to make it better. If you have walked or biked through the Park these past months, you have seen how the community continues to enjoy the trails more than ever. The Park provides a safe place to get outside, exercise, experience nature, enjoy pastoral views of the farm and the valley. Martial Cottle Park fills a need in all of us, so let's continue to work together to support it. Through generous donations from community members, Friends of Martial Cottle Park has funded various projects in the Park.

#### Park Projects

<u>Hedgerow Project</u>: The Hedgerow Project was the first focus project for Friends of Martial Cottle Park. Thanks to our members, donors and fundraising events, we have been able to contribute \$10,000 over the past few years plus another \$1,500 this year for a total of \$11,500.

<u>What's Growing Signs</u>: FOMCP funded signs that are installed throughout the park indicating the type of crops being grown by Jacob's Farms. Martial Cottle Park staff designed and installed the signs.

<u>School Bus Fund</u>: FOMCP is partnering with Environmental Volunteers, an organization that links funding for school bus transportation with local low-income schools so they can participate in school field trip programs. FOMCP will fund several school field trips to Martial Cottle Park.

<u>Farm Equipment Refurbishing</u>: Martial Cottle Park will be doing maintenance work and replacing tires on historical vehicles at the park and FOMCP will contribute towards equipment refurbishment.

#### **Upcoming Events**

We are making plans for a Cottle and Lester Historic Ranch tour in the spring before the area is closed for renovations. We will let you know when we have a date.
