

January Meeting Preview: VTA Access Study


Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) is studying opportunities to improve access to the Capitol and Branham Light Rail Stations. The study will identify transportation improvements that will make it easier to walk, bike, and take connecting transit to the light rail stations from the surrounding neighborhood. VTA will be conducting outreach to community members over the next month to identify key transportation issues in the study area and locations where improvements may be needed.

What is Proposition 19? By Jayshree Reddy

Prop 19 is a law in the state of California that went into effect in early 2021. It altered many of the existing laws that governed transferring your property taxes to different counties of the state. While Propositions 60 and 90 used to limit the counties you could move to, Prop 19 now allows you to transfer your tax anywhere across the state of California. This is a huge advantage for Californians.

Who does this proposition benefit?

- Benefits people over the age of 55. That's because the goal of this proposition is to help people in retirement to save money. They can do this by moving their property tax base to another county without having an increased expense to worry about.
- Benefits people with disabilities and others affected by wildfires or other disasters. These were pieces of other propositions that were pulled in under the same guidelines.

When a Californian decides to leave Santa Clara County, they might move elsewhere in California because of more affordable homes or a slower pace of life. With Prop 19, you can move like this while keeping your established property tax base.

My team recently helped someone sell a home that was purchased in 1976. The original purchase price was under \$40,000, and the property tax base today was only \$67,000. After selling their home, now worth \$1,000,000, they could move to a different area of California with all that equity and keep that low property tax base. That means that they are only going to be paying \$2,100 in property taxes annually. Without Prop 19, they would be paying over \$7,500 per year. That's an over \$500 per month difference, which can be a huge impact if you are living on a fixed income.

Make sure to talk to a financial advisor to see how you can take advantage of this proposition.
